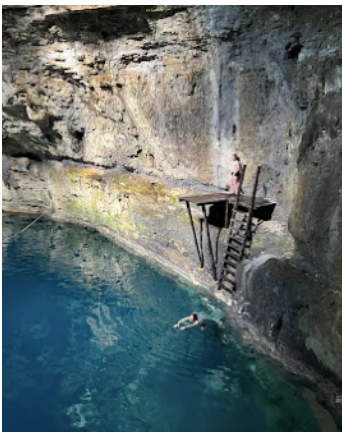
Private Tour to Cobá Ruins | Cave Cenote | Valladolid with a visit to Local Market, Cenote Zaci and Calzada de los Frailes

Travel back in time with us: at the archeological site of Cobá with the tallest pyramid in the Yucatán peninsula you get an impression of the era when the Mayan civilization was in full bloom. Then, find yourself in the eventful 16th century when the Spanish settled down in Mexico as we visit Valladolid – a colorful colonial town with a cenote in the middle of the city.

Tour Itinerary

9:00 Explore the Mayan ruins of Cobá

How was life in the jungle hundreds of years ago? Get a feeling of it when you walk through the remains of the Mayan settlement until the 42 meter high pyramid rises up in front of you. Learn about the native civilization and get in touch with the tropical flora & fauna.



11:30 See a Cenote out of this World

If you know about cenotes already or not yet, this one will put you in awe: visit a big otherworldly cave filled with ground water which formed naturally through the collapse of the porous limestone. A spectacular place for a refreshing swim and to find out about the underground river system this area of Mexico is famous for.
